
Good news - you're not a robot! You have a mind of your own and you can make your own choices. We sometimes call this 'free will'.





PEER PRESSURE GAME

Ask for a volunteer to sit in a chair in the middle at the front. Then ask for several more volunteers - 6 is a good number - and stand them either side of the seated volunteer. (It's a good idea to not put them too close to the seated one as the game tends to get rather noisy!)

The job of the seated volunteer is to sit in the chair and the job of the standing volunteers is to get the seated one out of their chair - but with their words only! (They are not allowed to make physical contact in any way whatsoever with the person in the chair)

Give them 30 seconds and tell them they can say anything they want (within reason!)

They can ask, they can persuade, they can promise, they can say anything they want! (They can promise a bag of sweets... they can say there's an alien in the playground...)

Encourage the rest of the class to join in with suggestions.

After 30 seconds, the seated volunteer is generally still in their chair...

Explain that even though the standing volunteers had tried to persuade them in many different ways - they couldn't <u>make</u> the seated one do anything...

It was their own personal choice to leave the chair or not.

Think:

Is there a time I listened to someone else, but then afterwards wished I hadn't? Is there a time I <u>didn't</u> listen to someone, but afterwards wished I had?








Challenge!

Add Sound Effects. After the days have been shown to the class ask each group to go back and add sound effects for example of Picture 7 Eve could say "mmmmmm" to convey her delight in the apple and the snake could hiss in triumph.

Further Challenge!

Add Emotion words. Each character can choose an emotion word or a word to describe how they're feeling. For example on picture 8 Eve could show the apple saying "tasty" or "try" and Adam could say "shocked" or "confused".

TIP. If you turn this into a performance or an assembly presentation, you could keep all the animals and trees in the background to create the sense of the garden throughout.

Made In God's Image

"I will call him Adam and I will give him mind of his own"

"But God, isn't that dangerous?"

"Maybe, but he has to be free to choose and do whatever he wants"

The Bible says that God made us in His image.

Does that mean God has 2 arms, 2 legs and a head? We can only guess about that! But it does mean that we have a lot of the same qualities as him on the inside...

Many Christians believe that through Bible stories we can find out lots about Gods character: who He is on the inside or what He's like. For example, from the story of Creation we can understand that God is creative. We also can find out that His creation brought Him delight.

Through the story of Adam and Eve Christians understand that God is relational (wanting friendship with us): that He's friendly. From the story Christians also understand that He loves people enough to let us make our own decisions - even if we make decisions that get us (or others) hurt. He created us to choose and not to be a robot! That means He respects us and our decisions. We could also understand from the story that He is just and fair - because Adam and Eve had to leave the garden because of their poor choice.

Faith Link Friends With God p.1

The Christian story of Creation teaches us that God thought that we as people were the most special thing that He created. It teaches Christians that He wants to be connected to us. Just like He walked in person with Adam and Eve in the garden He wants to walk with us today. So what does that mean? How can Christians walk with God today?



Many Christians believe that it's about having a connection- or a friendship -with God. Here are a few ways that Christians can feel close to God...

Praying (or talking to God). There are many different ways that

Christians do this. Some people talk from their heart to God in private (like a friend), some people pray in groups aloud together or follow a set prayer like **The Lords' Prayer** (see next page) that Jesus taught people to pray. Pray can cover many things and it's sometimes useful to remember the word **ACTS**



A is for Adoration. Praising God for being Lord over all and for who He is and for what He's like.

is for Confession. Confession is telling God the things that you've done that you're not proud of and asking God for His forgiveness. Also forgiving others who may have hurt you.

is for Thanksgiving. Thanking God for all the good things in your life and in the world around you.

S is for supplication (which means asking). Asking God to meet your needs and the needs of others. Sometimes Christians pray for a situation in their own life, or for a friend, for someone who is poorly or pray for something difficult going on in the world.

Going to Church

Many Christians feel closer to God by meeting together. Some people like to go to a beautiful old building and some people hold church in a school or even their house! The Bible says to Christians (in the book of Hebrews 10:25) 'you should meet together and encourage each other.'

At church people often sing songs of worship to God, hear the Bible and some teaching, pray together and spend time together.



Reading the Bible can be very important to many Christians. This is because Christians believe it to be the word of God and full of truth and wisdom. The Bible is a collection of 66 different books and includes stories, poems, letters, sayings and songs.

Sharing stories or experiences

Sharing stories or experiences often helps Christians be closer to God. These can be called 'testimonies' and these experiences are sometimes shared to encourage each other.

The Lord's Prayer

'Our Father in heaven, we pray that your name will always be kept holy.

We pray that your kingdom will come.

We pray that what you want will be done,
here on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us the food we need for each day.
Forgive the sins we have done,
just as we have forgiven those who did wrong

In the Creation story, God decides to give Adam and Eve a mind of their own: the freedom to choose. Lucifer, disguised as a snake, was very cunning. He asked Eve "Did God really say....?"

Lucifer couldn't <u>make</u> Adam and Eve break the rules... he couldn't force them but he could <u>persuade</u> them to... He could lie and trick them and tell them that they misunderstood. He could tell them that rules weren't fair and that it wouldn't matter if they did break Gods one and only rule. But he was wrong. He wasn't telling the truth.

Lucifer may have lied to them but it was Adam and Eve's <u>own choice</u> to break the rules. And so they were the ones who had to pay the price...

The story of Adam and Eve doesn't have a happy ending... it ends with sin (or wrong-doing) coming into the world and Adam & Eve having to leave Eden. In Christianity, this beginning of sin is sometimes called 'the fall' because Adam and Eve fell from perfection and things began to go wrong...



The Bible teaches that, just like Adam and Eve sinned (or did wrong), that we all do wrong. Do you remember that God warned Adam and Eve what would happen if they ate the fruit?

But this sad ending of the creation story is not the end of the big story of Christianity. God was so sad about not having friendship like he used to with people in the Garden of Eden, that he began planning a rescue mission to make things right again.

He would do this by finding someone to take all the sin away by dying on earth in our place, for our wrong-doing. This rescue had to be done by someone who would be prepared to freely choose to pay the price for each and every one of us. He sent his very own son, Jesus.

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish (die) but have eternal life.



Christians believe that Jesus lived on earth thousands of years after Adam and Eve. His mother was Mary and you may even celebrate his birth without knowing it - as it's the festival of Christmas. The Bible says that Jesus taught amazing things about how to love God and how to love others, he performed many miracles and had a huge amount of followers. Christianity teaches Jesus was crucified and died, but that he came back to life three days later, beating death forever.
